The deadline for applications is 31 July 2024. Our partners have also announced <u>opportunities</u> for early-career professionals earlier this month.

For those of you planning to attend the 11th SCAR Open Science Conference in Pucón, Chile, from August 19th to 23rd, 2024, make use of the <u>early bird registration rates</u> available until 31 May. Extensive efforts have been made to ensure that registration fees are not a constraint on attendance. Early bird registration will be \$100 USD for students and \$140 USD for regular participants. The registration portal will launch within the next couple of weeks.

   Craig was a distinguished scientist and expert in Antarctic terrestrial
   Antarctic ecosystems who made numerous important contributions to
   SCAR's work as well as providing invaluable mentoring and support to
   many. Our heartfelt condolences go out to his family, friends, and
   colleagues.
- It is with great sorrow that SCAR informs of the passing of <u>Dr Diana Wall</u>.
  Diana was awarded the SCAR Presidents Medal for Outstanding
  Achievement in 2010 in recognition of her work examining the response
  of soil biodiversity and ecosystem processes to environmental change.
  She was a key member of several of SCAR's Life Sciences programmes,
  contributed to the 2014 SCAR Horizon Scan and served on the SCAR
  Development Council.
- 2023 SCAR Fellow Dr Alice Oates is currently running a <u>community</u> <u>survey on disability and Antarctic Research</u>. The survey is open to all and should take around 10-20 minutes to complete. French, Spanish and Russian translations will be added soon.


of the coupled polar atmosphere and climate. The workshop will be help in Aussois, France, and online from **17-22 November 2024**.

- The University at Buffalo is looking for <u>Postdoctorate Associate</u> to support the GHub science gateway. GHub host datasets, work flows, and tools to unify ice sheet observations and modeling provide uncertainty quantification, and improve estimates of future sea-level rise.
