### **SCAR News**



Planning for the 5th International Polar Year Following their recently <u>renewed partnership</u> agreement, SCAR and the International Arctic Science Committee (IASC) and SCAR are pleased to confirm that <u>preparatory work has</u> started for a 5th International Polar Year (IPY) in 2032-33, reflecting the urgent need for coordinated international research to tackle the biggest challenges of polar research, for both the Polar Regions themselves and for the world as a whole. In the lead up to the 5th IPY, SCAR and IASC are also pleased to announce a joint SCAR-IASC Polar Conference in 2030.

Our future depends on us: Animation on impacts of climate change in Antarctica Earlier this year, SCAR worked with scientists across the globe to produce the Antarctic Climate Change and the Environment Decadal Synopsis (ACCE). The report provides a summary of a decade's worth of research, and its eight chapters leave little room for doubt: The continent is warming, and so is its surrounding Southern Ocean. The key messages of the report are summarised in a <u>new animation</u> released for Antarctica Day.





## 2022 Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation SCAR Fellowship announced

We are delighted to announce that the 2022 Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation SCAR Fellowship is awarded to Hanna Yevchun from the State Institution National Antarctic Scientific Center, Kyiv, Ukraine. She will visit the British Antarctic Survey, Cambridge, UK, for her project entitled "Remotely detecting and mapping biodiversity in Antarctica using VHR satellite and UAV data".

#### SCAR Report 43 on Antarctic Seismic Data Library System (SDLS) Guidelines

The Antarctic Seismic Data Library System for Cooperative Research (SDLS) was established and endorsed by SCAR in 1991 and has become the primary host of marine multi-channel seismic (MCS) data around Antarctica. <u>SCAR Report</u> <u>43</u> describes updates to the SDLS organizational structure, guidelines and procedures.





# SCAR Ant-ICON I SC-ATS science-policy fellowship programme launched

Applications are now open for the <u>inaugural</u> <u>SCAR Ant-ICON I SC-ATS science-policy</u> <u>fellowship programme</u>. The fellowships are open to early-mid career researchers from all SCAR member countries. The fellowship programme will fund two fellows in 2023: one to participate in the CEP/ATCM meetings in Helsinki, Finland from 29 May-8 June 2023 (expected start date in early February 2023), and one to participate in the SC-CAMLR/CCAMLR meetings in Hobart, TAS, Australia in 16-27 October 2023 (expected start date in April/May 2023).

The application deadline is 16 January 2023.

The application deadline is 1st March 2023.
