



Grants of up to £6000 are awarded to extend the scope of an existing
research project. The application deadline is 17 March.

### **Obituaries**

- The SCAR community is deeply saddened to hear of the death of <u>Professor David Vaughan</u>, former Director of Science at the British Antarctic Survey. David had a long history of involvement in SCAR's work during his career as a glaciologist, which spanned over three decades.
- It is with deep sadness that SCAR has learnt of the recent death from cancer of <u>Dr Andrés Barbosa</u>. Dr Barbosa was a biologist and ecologist, a leading expert in the study of Antarctic penguins. He led the working group on Wildlife Health Monitoring of SCAR's Expert Group on Birds and Marine Mammals (<u>EG-BAMM</u>).
