Publications from the SCAR and wider research community

A new study, conceived and supported by INSTANT, used octopus DNA to discover that the West Antarctic Ice Sheet (WAIS) likely collapsed during the Last Interglacial period around 125,000 years ago – when global temperatures were similar to today. The study was led by Professor Jan Strugnell and Dr Sally Lau from ARC Securing Antarctica's Environmental Future at James Cook University, in collaboration with an international team of biological and geological scientists. 'Genomic evidence for West Antarctic Ice Sheet collapse during the Last Interglacial' was published in Science.

- 'Warmer Antarctic summers in recent decades linked to earlier stratospheric final warming occurrences', published in <u>Nature</u> <u>Communications Earth & Environment</u>.
- 'Hybridization barriers between the congeneric antarctic notothenioid fish Notothenia coriiceps and Notothenia rossii', published in <u>Polar</u> <u>Biology</u>.


