2023 SCAR Fellowship Scheme

SCAR launched its 2023 Antarctic-related Fellowships for early-career researchers this month. Following the launch of the [Polar Initiative](#) in 2022 the Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation has funded an additional SCAR fellowship and as a result SCAR will offer in total four to five fellowships of up to USD \$15,000 each for 2023.

The deadline for the SCAR fellowship applications is **31 July 2023**.

SCAR Bulletin 209 Published - XXXVII SCAR Delegates' Meeting Report

[Bulletin 209](#) contains the Report of the XXXVII SCAR Delegates' Meeting held in Goa, India and online on 5-7 September 2022. The report includes updates on SCAR's Science Groups, Scientific Research Programmes (SRPs), Standing Committees and details of a new Programme Planning Group (PPG), as well as a discussion on SCAR's Strategic Plan 2023-28 and the proposed International Polar Year 2032-33.



SCAR Visiting Scholarship Report: Dr Hongjie Xie

[Dr Hongjie Xie \(University of Texas San Antonio\)](#) reports on his [SCAR Visiting Scholarship](#), hosted by the Universidad de Concepción (Chile), supported by Professor Alfonso Fernandez. The SCAR Visiting Scholar scheme supported two visits to Universidad de Concepción in March 2022 and January 2023 to support the Antarctic research programme, with a focus on remote sensing of sea ice, ice sheet, and ice shelf, and Antarctica's contribution to global sea level rise. Applications for the 2023 [SCAR Visiting Scholar Scheme](#) will open later this year.

Ant-ICON Community Workshop Report

Ant-ICON's Theme 2 (Human Impacts) held two community workshops late last year to gauge interest in a Ant-ICON State of the Antarctic Environment project. The outcomes from the workshops have been [compiled into a report](#) and have also been used as the basis to compile a Working Paper for submission to this years CEP meeting in Helsinki.





New RINGS Whitepaper

The RINGS Action Group has published a new white paper titled ["International collaboration is urgently needed for airborne surveys in Enderby Land to fill the largest RINGS data gap"](#). This is a preliminary planning and scoping paper that seeks to identify potential plans and solutions to support the RINGS project in Enderby Land. The primary objective of RINGS is to develop a comprehensive reference bed topography dataset around the entire Antarctic coast.
