

Inception of the Antarctic Monitoring and Assessment Programme (AnMAP)

This month marks the inception of the Antarctic Monitoring and Assessment Programme (AnMAP) as a new body under SCAR. AnMAP has been established in recognition of the planetary chemical pollution crisis, and the unique value of the Earth's Polar Regions as barometers of Planetary Health. AnMAP has been co-developed with the Arctic Monitoring and Assessment Programme (AMAP), will be hosted by Griffith University, and is a UN Ocean Decade Project.

AnMAP was a founding objective of the SCAR <u>ImPACT</u> group, and the two SCAR bodies will work closely to facilitate standardised, quality-assured, continuous chemical observation data is generated and synthesised for policy.




AGATA Kickoff Meeting Report

- SOOS has published a joint statement and urgent call for action following the 2023 SOOS Symposium 'Southern Ocean in a Changing World'.
- Individuals who have been part of polar fieldwork/expeditions of at least two weeks in length since June 2021 are invited to participate in the first part of a research study on "team trust dynamics in Polar environments".
 All questions should be directed to the primary investigator, Andres Käosaar. The questionnaire requires 10 minutes to complete.
- The International Cryosphere Climate Initiative (ICCI) is seeking <u>ECR</u> volunteers for the Cryosphere Pavilion at COP28, to be held in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, from 30 November 12 December 2023. The application deadline is 4 September 2023.
- The Brazilian Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation (MCTI) and the National Committee for Antarctic Research (CONAPA) have just published the <u>Ten-Year Plan for Antarctic Science in Brazil (2023-2032)</u>.

- The Southern Ocean Summer School 2024 will take place in Corsica from 7-14 May 2024, at the <u>Institut d'Etudes Scientifiques de Cargèse (IESC)</u>. The school aims to provide a comprehensive overview of the challenges faced by Southern Ocean science. The registration deadline is 31 October 2023.
