
## SCAR at the Polar Symposium 2024 "The Cold is Getting Hot"

The symposium brought together distinguished scientists, representatives of non-governmental organisations, holders of indigenous knowledge, and policymakers to discuss the challenges facing polar regions and their broad implications on the global system. #### Plastic-AG Infographic Competition

The SCAR Plastic Action Group (Plastic-AG) is excited to announce a <u>competition for early</u> <u>career researchers</u> to create an infographic describing plastic pollution in polar regions. Andy was an active, distinguished scientist covering a wide range of research areas, including krill biology, bioacoustics and systems level ecology, as well as fisheries, food security and human health. Our thoughts are with his family, friends and colleagues.


