The <u>10th SCAR Open Science Conference</u> was held online from 1-10 August and it was great to see so many of you there. The conference was hosted by the National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research (<u>NCPOR</u>), who will also be hosting the upcoming SCAR Delegates Meeting (5-7 September). With over 1,500 participants, 64 events and 5 satellite meetings, the conference showcased the whole breath of Antarctic research. We hope you had the chance to discuss new ideas, present your latest findings, make new connections and refresh old ones. We especially enjoyed reading about your impressions and experiences on social media using the hashtag #SCAR2022.

We are looking back at eight days of plenary sessions, mini-symposia, parallel sessions and workshops. The first week of events finished with the closing ceremony, where we also awarded the 2022 SCAR Medals - congratulations to the 2022 recipients Pippa, Elisabeth, Bethan and Stephen! All the events are still available for you to watch in the past events section on the Events Platform. The recordings will also be uploaded to our SCAR YouTube channel. We hope you enjoyed the conference and are already looking forward to seeing you at the next Open Science Conference in Pucón, Chile, in 2024.

2022 SCAR Medal recipients announced

SCAR is delighted to announce the recipients of the 2022 SCAR Medals.

The 2022 SCAR Medal for Excellence in Antarctic Research is jointly awarded to Prof Pippa Whitehouse of Durham University, UK and Prof Elisabeth Sikes of Rutgers University, USA. Prof Whitehouse is a leading expert on glacial isostatic adjustment (GIA), the response of the solid Earth to changes in ice and ocean loading as ice sheets change with time. Prof Sikes' contributions to

Southern Ocean/ Antarctic Science spans her involvement in the science communities in three countries (Australia, New Zealand and the United States).

The 2022 SCAR Medal for International Scientific Coordination is awarded to Prof Stephen Ackley of the University of Texas at San Antonio, USA. Prof Ackley has initiated, undertaken, or participated in several international programmes and partnerships, including the SCAR Expert Group on Antarctic Sea Ice Processes and Climate for which he was the founding Chair in 1998.

The 2022 SCAR Medal for Education and Communication is awarded to <u>Dr Bethan Davies</u> of of Royal Holloway University and Newcastle University, UK. Dr Davies wrote and developed the <u>Antarctic Glaciers website</u> as part of her commitment to outreach, education and communication.
