About Auckland

The host city, Auckland, is the largest city in New Zealand and is considered the 'gateway' to the country. Otherwise known as the City of Sails, it is a beautiful city built around a stunning waterfront and unspoiled harbour. With a population of about 1.5 million, it is also New Zealand's commercial centre.

The Viaduct Basin and its cache of restaurants and bars is easily accessible, as is the Wynyard Quarter. Commissioned for the Rugby World Cup in September 2011, the Wynyard precinct has a family atmosphere where you can enjoy dining on North Wharf, tram rides through the Quarter and walks in Jellicoe Park.

About the Conference Venue

The SCAR meetings will be held at SKYCITY Auckland Convention Centre located in the heart of Auckland. The Centre is conveniently situated near Queen Street (the central city's retail strip).

The Convention Centre is connected to two hotels: SKYCITY Grand, which is built directly above the Convention Centre and SKYCITY Hotel, part of the SKYCITY complex that includes restaurants, bars, the Sky Tower and a Theatre.
